Biographical Sketch

Selma Olivia Moberg was born on October 3, 1869 in Sweden. She served as a missionary to China from 1903-1924 through the South Chihli mission.

The South Chihli mission was an undenominational mission founded in 1896 by Rev. and Mrs. Horace W. Houlding from the United States. The mission was comprised of 14 missionaries, of 7 different denominations. It was considered to be entirely evangelical, with its main goal to bring the gospel to China. The South Chihli mission operated several stations throughout the Zhili (now Hebei) region south of Beijing. The mission headquarters was located at Tai-ming fu, with a farm, boys' school and orphanage, and girls' school and orphanage. Selma lived at worked at the Wei Hsien station. The South Chihli Mission dissolved in the 1920s.

Selma died on December 14, 1934 in Brockton, Massachusetts and is buried in Melrose Cemetery.

Content

The collection includes postcards Moberg send to Anna Bjork, publications from the mission (in English and Chinese), the New Testament in Chinese, and textiles and cultural objects from China.
