The English translation of a Swedish travel diary by Johann Oscar (Samuelson) Rolander was given to SSIRC in March 1982, typewritten copy received in April 1982 by Clarence F. Biographical Sketch

Johann Oscar (Samuelson) Rolander was born in Västra Ryd, Östergötland on June 15,1847. He arrived in the U.S. with his parents on June 1,1868. He resided in Swedona, Illinois, then in Ellis, Kansas, where he worked for the Union Pacific Railroad. On February 9,1872 he took a homestead in New Gottland, Kansas. He lived there until his retirement in 1910, when he moved to McPherson, Kansas. He married Mathilda Charlotta Peterson on April 18,1874 in Salina, Kansas. In 1911, he made a trip back to Sweden. He died on August 27,1932 in Kingsburg, California.
