"The fabrication of atrocity: Media coverage of the Bryce Committee Report, 1915 – 1924." Working title of a project being pursued here and at the Bodleian Library, Oxford, in conjunction with my 2010-11 sabbatical.

A critical anthology of propaganda. I have been gathering, from archives and via inter-library loan, a significant collection of propaganda artifacts. Those form the core readings in my Propaganda course. I'm setting them in a standard format: critical headnote, artifact, annotated bibliography.
