BACKGROUND

A selective, private liberal arts and sciences college founded in 1860.

A **115-acre** wooded campus in Rock Island, Illinois, on the Mississippi River in the Quad-Cities metropolitan area (pop. **400,000**), 165 miles west of Chicago.

A residential campus: first-year and sophomore students live in residence halls; juniors may choose transitional living areas (apartment-style housing on campus); seniors live on campus or in the neighborhood.

Academic buildings range from Old Main, renovated in 2011-13, to The Gerber Center, combining the library, dining and student activities.

ACADEMICS

90 majors and related areas of study in the arts and sciences and pre-professional programs, leading to the Bachelor of Arts.

Selective Honors Program with choice of one of two tracks: Foundations (humanities) or Logos (sciences).

Distinguishing features include Senior Inquiry and Augie Choice— **\$2,000** to support every student's internship, research with a professor or study abroad.

STUDENTS

2,500 students from diverse social, ethnic, religious, cultural and geographic backgrounds, representing more than twothirds of the United States and about **20 countries**.

More than a third score 27 or higher on the ACT; more than a quarter were in the **top 10** percent of their high school class.

86% of first-year studentscontinue to the sophomore year;90% of traditional studentsgraduate in four years.

The learning environment is close and collaborative, with a **student:faculty ratio** of **12:1** and average class size of **22**; all classes taught by faculty (no graduate teaching assistants).

ATHLETICS & ACTIVITIES

12 men's and 11 women's varsity teams compete in the College Conference of Illinois and Wisconsin (CCIW) and NCAA Division III; many club sports, intramural and recreational programs; 200 student groups, clubs and activities.

ALUMNI SUCCESS

97% of 2014 graduates were employed, in a professional internship or in graduate school within a year of graduation.

AFFORDABILITY: COSTS, WORTH, SCHOLARSHIPS & FINANCIAL AID

The listed 2015-16 tuition and fees, with housing and meals, was just above \$48,000—but the **average cost per student**, including financial aid, was less than **\$25,000**.

Because of our financial aid, the cost of an Augustana education is comparable to the costs at large public universities.

Compare with the costs of your regional universities, and then consider the value of an Augustana education.

Augustana is worth more because we can offer more, financially and academically.

98% of students receive financial aid; nearly **\$50 million** is awarded annually from various sources, including Augustana scholarships. Students awarded scholarships and financial aid may receive **\$8,000-\$48,000**, depending on many factors.

Dr. Adam Kaul of the **anthropology** department researches Irish street musicians, and has been a great mentor for his students in **their own research**. He also inspires musically, performing with his wife in a **popular local band** called Subatlantic.

Physics/ pre-med major Mark Hoffman '15 researched nuclear physics with Dr. Nathan Frank in his first year; then interned with a local engineering firm; then researched **optics** with Dr. James van Howe; and performed data analysis for the Texas Medical Center as a senior.

> ln 1990, paleontology professor Dr. William Hammer found the first dinosaur discovered in Antarctica, Cryolophosaurus ellioti. His students work with fossils in the paleo labs at Augustana's Fryxell Geology Museumsome through paid internships.

Students and faculty use the college's 3 environmental field stations, totaling more than 600 acres, for field research, and traverse the Mississippi River with the geography department's 2 research boats.

Dr. Kimberly Murphy of the **biology** department received a 3-year grant from the National Science Foundation to fund her students addressing real-world scientific research questions.

Sprinter and hurdler David Voland '15 became the college's 157th Academic All-American. A mathematics and secondary education major, he spent a summer volunteer teaching in Cuenca, Ecuador. Now he's training for the Olympic Trials.

History professor Dr. Lendol Calder was awarded Illinois Professor of the Year. One of his popular first-year general education courses is nicknamed "Love Shack." Augustana is one of a few schools privileged to send student interns to the Texas Medical Center, a **top cancer research center**, for students majoring in the **sciences**, **business**, **English, psychology, philosophy, communication sciences and disorders, art** and more.

Psychology and communication studies major Kerry Robbins '15 interned for the Children's Art Project at the Texas Medical Center—giving her the edge to become a certified child life specialist.

> Communication sciences and disorders majors have at least 3 terms of clinical work with faculty supervision at Augustana's Center for Speech, Language, and Hearing on campus.

Adam Populorum '15 studied **Chinese**, **Spanish and international business**. He used his skills during an internship with Abbott Laboratories, where he created a marketing strategy for a new international product.

More than **CORE** each year organizations visit CORE each year to recruit students for internships in the Quad Cities, Chicago, 15 states, and about 15 countries around the world.

Pre-occupational therapy majors Mary Kiolbasa '15 and Alexandria Roehrenbeck '15 started the group Viking Pups in 2012, training service dogs for the disabled. Their first pups were named Augie, Thor and Oden.

Gary Miller '15 majored in **creative writing and theatre**, competed in **varsity** wrestling and football, was a member of Phi Omega Phi, and once started a campus mud war. He used Augie Choice for a summer intensive program at the Atlantic Acting School, and is pursuing a career in comedy. Biology major Emily Trenkamp '15 first became interested in public health while volunteering in a clinic during Augustana's health care service-learning trip to Nicaragua. Now she is at the University of Iowa School of Public Health.

Now a student at Harvard University Graduate School of Design, **art, art history and environmental studies** graduate Veronica Smith '12 cites Augustana's **interdisciplinary and serviceoriented** approach as the basis for her success in her current studies.

acceptance rate to grad schools since 1997. Economics and political science major Joe Wood '15 used Augie Choice for the fall term in Brazil, and also spent a summer learning Arabic in Morocco. Today he's an economist with the Bureau of Labor Statistics in Washington, D.C.

Biology professor Dr. Bob Tallitsch co-wrote *Human Anatomy*, the best-selling anatomy textbook in the United States, and the best-seller of *all* books in Italy in October 2015. Augustana students also **learn anatomy hands-on** in the college's human cadaver lab—a **rare benefit for undergrads**.

In 2010, graduate students at Midwestern University's School of Health-Related Sciences were sitting in their first day of neuroscience class. The professor asked, *"How many of you have had a course in neuroanatomy or neuroscience?"*

About 20 students About 7 raised their hands. The professor then asked, "How many of you are from Augustana College in Illinois?"

AUGUSTANA HAS A HIGH SUCCESS RATE FOR MATCHING FIRST-YEAR ROOMMATES, AND A VARIETY OF PLACES TO LIVE ON CAMPUS—FROM HISTORIC HOUSE ON THE HILL TO THE MODERN LAYOUT OF SWANSON COMMONS.

If you live in Seminary Hall, you'll be at the heart of campus, and near the planetarium, the chapel and the geology museum.

If you live in Westerlin, you can work out at AugiePlex in your own building, or head over to the PepsiCo Recreation Center without your coat.

And if you move into a Parkander apartment on the ridge as a junior, you'll have more privacy—yet still be able to see the lights of The Gerber Center reflecting in the Slough at night.





THE AUGUSTANA ADVANTAGE

Juniors can live in apartments called Transitional Living Areas (TLAs), including **38 houses and 14 suite-style apartment buildings** around the edge of campus. TLAs range from single apartments to a house big enough for 15 people.
