

This catalog is your guide to all of the study away options created, sponsored or endorsed by Augustana College. Here you will find descriptions of each program, including academic, financial and logistical information, as well as recommendations on how to select the program that is right for you.

In addition to the program pages, there are informational pages that describe everything from the application process, pre-departure orientation, financial aid and other considerations to help you make informed choices about study away.

The informational pages at the front of this document, along with the introductory pages for each program type, contain valuable information which can help you find the best match of program for your academic, career and personal growth goals.

On the program pages you will also find symbols designed to help you quickly identify certain key elements of each program. We use these symbols to provide a simply visual cue to help you quickly identify program features. Below is the legend which explains what each symbol references:

OUR PROGRAMS

Augustana runs three major types of programs, each in its own season during the year:



Students are away from campus for up to 16 weeks during Fall or Spring. Semester programs can come in many shapes and forms, including student exchanges, university enrollment abroad, full-time internships, or sponsored study abroad programs through a private educational organization.

Students on a semester program typically enroll in 4-6 courses, equivalent to 12-18 credits. Some programs pair 1-2 courses with a full-time internship, allowing you to earn up to 12 credits of internship. It is recommended that students who enroll in a semester-length program take no more than 2 courses in their major field of study and utilize the remaining credits to complete General Education or graduation requirements or to focus coursework on the local culture, history and society.

Many spring semester programs may also incorporate Augustana's J-Term as they often begin in January. If desired a student can also apply for both a Fall & Spring to complete a full academic year abroad program.

J-term programs have Augustana faculty lead a group of 10-30 students on 1-3 weeks of travel. Some programs contain all the required coursework in the designated January J-Term period, others pair a January course with a Fall Semester on-campus course, and a few are not in January at all, combining on-campus coursework in Spring Semester with a 2-3 week travel program in June.

Each J-Term program will typically offer between 4-6 credits, with a single course or department designation, so J-Term courses will be more focused and field-specific than summer or semester study away.





Whether sponsored by Augustana (Ecuador, Dijon) or external programs with transferable credit, summer programs are an option for students who seek an immersive experience but who do not believe a semester abroad is a good fit in their academic program.

A typical summer program will provide between 4-8 credits. Most summer programs will be treated as transfer credit and will not include Augustana tuition charges, though students will need to register their program with Augustana's International Programs Office in order to earn transfer credit or Augie Choice funding.



While we are sure that there is a program in our catalog which is perfect for you, not every program will be. Each of the program types listed on the prior page has its strengths and its drawbacks. Some require students to demonstrate greater initiative and independence but offer a more profound immersion experience, others provide more direct support and supervision but may lack the depth or breadth of options of others. We believe that with a little research and some intentional decision-making, every student can find the program that is a great match for their goals. As you review the program types, we recommend you consider the following:

CONSIDER YOUR INTENTIONS

Before focusing on a particular destination, consider your intentions. Do you want to be introduced to a culture? Are you seeking work experience? Maybe language fluency? Study in a particular field? A university experience? Do you prefer to travel with a group, or would you be comfortable if it turned out you were the only Augustana student on a program? Your goals for study away can be even more important in the decision process than the location of a program because what you choose to do while abroad is as important as where you choose to go.

MEET WITH ACADEMIC ADVISORS

Meet with your academic advisors to discuss your goals, scheduling of classes, and the best times for you to participate in study away. If you are a double major, you will want to check in with both academic departments to ensure that your study away choice does not hinder your ability to graduate on schedule. While J-Term and Summer courses do not pose the same scheduling challenges as semesters, all three options should be considered, depending on your goals for study away.

DISCUSS FINANCIAL ABILITY

Discuss finances with your family. Even though they are the longest of the three program types, semester programs are often the least expensive, due to the availability of financial aid and the structure where you replace on-campus costs with the study away charges. J-Term and Summer programs are considered additional study beyond the 2 semesters and include additional costs above and beyond the charges for a year of study at Augustana.

UNDERSTAND YOUR NEEDS & LIMITATIONS

Be realistic about limitations. If you have a significant physical or mental health challenge which impacts your life on campus, the impact is almost certain to be greater while abroad. Consider your needs, the program structures, and any special accommodations you might need to ensure your health as you consider both the location and the length of your study away program.

THE APPLICATION PROCESS

Due to the timing of each program type, Augustana uses a series of application cycles throughout the year. Each application cycle is divided between the Primary Application Period and the Extended Application Period. The Primary Period has a set due date and many programs will close to new applications after this period. The Extended Application Period allows some programs to extend their application deadline and accept students on a firstcome, first-served basis. Only programs which have available space after the Primary Application Period will accept applications during the Extended period. This is true for all three types of study away programming at Augustana: Summer, Semester and J-Term.

Since there will be some elements of the application process which are unique to each program type (Semester, Summer and J-Term) there is specific information on each application process at the beginning of each of these 3 sections of our catalog. You should use the specific application process outlined for the program type you are seeking to join.

What follows are some guidelines which are true for ALL THREE types of programs.

Online Application

Augustana applications are completed at http://augustana.studioabroad.com

Use the step by step instructions for this process available from the IOP Office and found at www.augustana.edu/studyaway to create your account and apply for the program of your choice.

Deposits

All applications have a required \$300 deposit, of which \$100 is nonrefundable. However, students who apply during the Primary Application Period are required to deposit only the nonrefundable \$100 deposit, with the remaining \$200 paid after a student is accepted into the program by Augustana. Students applying during the Extended Period must deposit the full \$300 at that time. Deposits by cash or check are accepted at the Business Office in Sorensen Hall, or students can pay deposits online at: https://www.augustana.edu/study-away-deposit

Choices

Students may opt to apply to multiple programs during any application cycle but must indicate their preference (enroll in all, or a ranking of options) to the IOP Director by email at the time of application. A student who wishes to apply to multiple programs but enroll only in one must make only one deposit. A student who wishes to participate in multiple programs must make a deposit for each program to which they are applying.

Orientation

Students accepted into a J-Term program or Summer program will be notified of orientation and predeparture meetings for their program, needed registration for courses, and payment schedules when they receive their acceptance notification. Mandatory orientation assignments and meetings for all Augustana Summer programs, Fall semester programs and Spring + June J-term programs will be held in the Spring Semester. Orientation assignments and meetings for Spring semester programs and January J-Term programs will be held during the Fall semester.

J-Term and Augustana-sponsored summer program orientation will be conducted by each program's Augustana faculty director in the semester prior to departure, with online assignments and at least 1 meeting led by the IOP Director.

Students accepted into semester abroad programs will complete online orientation activities and will be required to attend several orientation meetings designed for all semester-away participants and led by the Director of International & Off-Campus Programs in the semester prior to departure. There may also be several additional pre-departure requirements to be completed by students for the external or non-Augustana program provider.

Withdrawal

Students may withdraw from any program and receive a refund of \$200 of their \$300 deposit up until the Refund Guarantee Deadline for each program. After this date for each program students will be responsible for any shared or nonrefundable costs expended on their behalf for the program. Early withdrawal is recommended as the later a student withdraws from a program the greater the total of nonrefundable charges will be.

NON-AUGUSTANA PROGRAM APPLICATIONS

OVERVIEW

Augustana encourages students to thoroughly review the options made available by the college before exploring external or unaffiliated study away opportunities. Students who decide to enroll in a non-Augustana or independent study away program may still be eligible for Augustana grants, scholarships and aid, and may also receive assistance in transfer of credit to Augustana from the International & Off-Campus Program Office. Students should anticipate that a review process for any external program will be required, as well as separate processes for course transfer approval and grant, scholarship or financial aid approval. These processes vary depending on the qualities and timing of the external program.

SUMMER

Students who wish to participate in a non-Augustana summer internship or summer study program should visit with the Director of International & Off-Campus programs to start the process in motion. The IOP Office will require some basic documentation of the program and will provide students with information and appropriate documentation to transfer credits from the summer program back to Augustana. Additionally, IOP can assist students with locating both internal and external scholarships and grants which may apply to the summer study program.

JANUARY TERM

Augustana does not recommend that students engage in external or unaffiliated J-Term programming as there is no transfer of financial aid funding to an external provider for a January Term program. While some grants, such as Augie Choice, may be possible for such an experience, they are not guaranteed.

SEMESTER

While we certainly encourage students to review the pool of Augustana endorsed programs prior to seeking an external option, we recognize that there may be considerations which might motivate a student to apply for such programs. In these cases, it may still be possible for a student to receive Augustana financial aid or scholarships by enrolling in the program through Augustana. Students who wish to do this should speak with the Director of IOP as soon as possible to begin the application process. Application and the availability of financial aid will be dependent upon enrollments within the Augustana pool of programs. For this reason applications for external programs will only be accepted during the extended enrollment period for each semester (Dec-Feb. for Fall, Feb-May for Spring). Students who do not qualify to enroll in the external program through Augustana, or programs which are not eligible for this option, are encouraged to discuss other possible enrollment & transfer credit options with the Director of International Programs.

Applying and being accepted into an Augustana or Augustana-endorsed study away program is the first step on the path to your off-campus experience. Once you have been approved there will be several other expectations for you. We would like you to be aware of these in advance of your application, which is why we include these in this catalog. Here are several assignments, expectations and responsibilities you should anticipate as you consider an Augustana study away program.

- ENROLLMENT &
- PREDEPARTURE
- EXPECTATIONS

All students must maintain a 2.50 GPA (2.00 for J-Term programs and higher for some semester programs) to be considered for a study away program. This GPA must be maintained in the time between acceptance and departure. If a student drops below the minimum required GPA prior to the departure date, their approval to join the program may be rescinded, including the transfer of any financial aid to the specified program.

Once accepted into an Augustana or Augustana-sponsored program students will have several required documents to either complete or sign. These documents will be housed on the same Studio Abroad website that was used to apply for the program. A student is only cleared to join the study away program if all documents marked "PRIORITY" are completed.

Students enrolled in any Augustana or Augustana-sponsored program are also required to complete pre-departure orientation. This is comprised of several online assignments, also found on the Studio Abroad website, and required attendance at regularly scheduled orientation meetings. A student who fails to attend the required orientation meetings or fails to complete online assignments, evaluations, quizzes or documents, can have their approval for the study away program revoked.

Students who applied for a program during the Primary Application Period must Confirm their program placement by turning in a payment of \$200 (in addition to the initial \$100 Application Fee) by the date indicated in their acceptance letter. This payment will be counted towards the program fee (summer or J-Term) or towards the tuition costs of the semester away (semester programs). Students who applied during the Extended Application Period must turn in both the \$100 nonrefundable Application Fee and the \$200 program deposit at the time of application. If, for whatever reason, they are either denied approval for their proposed program, the \$200 program deposit is refunded to the student.

For J-Term and Summer programs, all program payments must be made by the designated due dates for the approved program. Failure to complete program payments by the final due date will lead to dismissal from the program and potential charges for nonrefundable and shared program expenses related.

For semester programs, all charges from the external provider will be paid by Augustana College on behalf of the approved student. The student is responsible for paying the appropriate Augustana charges (tuition, fees, housing and/or meal plan costs) as identified for each program. These charges should be paid on the same schedule as would be expected for the same semester offered on campus. Students who fail to complete payments for their semester off-campus will face the same restrictions and penalties as those who fail to complete on-campus semester fees and payments.

Students approved for a semester programs must then apply to the program provider for acceptance. Once accepted by both Augustana and the program provider, students must complete all predeparture expectations, documents, assignments, and materials required by the program partner, provider or sponsor just as they must complete all Augustana required documents.



SEMESTER

If you have been accepted into one of the college's "Endorsed Semester Programs", you are eligible for financial aid to pay for the expenses of that semester, receiving the same aid you would receive towards tuition costs as if you were to be studying on campus. The same applies to any grants or scholarships you have earned which are used to cover room or board fees if those are included in the cost of the semester away. The one exception to this transfer of financial aid would be any work-study hours which are assigned during the year. As work-study is not an option on the study away program, that option for aid is suspended for you while you are away but will resume upon your return.

In addition to standard financial aid through Augustana, the State of Illinois or the Federal Government, you may also apply for grants specific to your study away experience, whether through Augustana (Augie Choice, Freistat Grants, etc.), the program partner (IES, CIEE, ISA, etc.) and from outside sources. The IOP Office and the Financial Assistance Office can help you find information about external grants and scholarships.

SUMMER

Summer programs, whether operated by Augustana or independent programs from which you will transfer credits, are not eligible for financial aid for Augustana students. No tuition-based grants or scholarships used during the school year extend into the summer. However, students may still seek to use study away specific grants, whether Augustana-based (Augie Choice, Freistat, etc.), provider-based (IES, CAPA, etc.) or independent.

J-TERM

As with summer, J-Term programs do not qualify for Augustana financial aid (grants, scholarships) as they do not contain a tuition charge as part of the program fee. Students may still seek to use study away specific grants, whether Augustana-based (Augie Choice, Freistat, etc.), provider-based (IES, CAPA, etc.) or independent.

STUDENT LOANS: Some student loan types can be expanded to increase the loan capacity when there are expenses related to a study away program which form part of the student's expenses for that academic year. This is true of all three types of study away programming. Students who wish to increase their loan total in a given year due to study away costs should meet with an advisor in the Financial Aid Office to discuss options for loan capacity increases.

To be eligible for Augie Choice for a study away program, the following criteria apply:

1.

The student must not have received Augie Choice funds for a prior experience. It is a one-time grant and cannot be requested a second time.

2.

The program chosen by the student must either be A) an Augustana-sponsored or endorsed study away program bearing academic credit, B) an Augustana-sponsored co-curricular tour, such as an international athletic team tour, international music ensemble tour or international program run by an approved co-curricular organization, or C) a non-Augustana international credit-bearing study away or internship away program which has been approved by the Director of the International & Off-Campus Office.

3.


Students may use Augie Choice for domestic or non-international study away programs offered by Augustana College if, and only if, the coursework on said program provides students with credit for a Diversity-themed (D-Suffix) course or has received special approval from both the Provost and the International & Off-Campus Programs Committee.

4.

For all qualifying credit-bearing study away programs, students must be able to demonstrate that they will have completed no fewer than 4 semesters on campus or 60 credits of Augustana coursework by the departure date of the program in order to be eligible for Augie Choice. Transfer students may qualify with 2 semesters or 30 credits completed at Augustana at the time of departure. For Augie Choice approved non-academic or co-curricular tours, such as athletic and music tours, students are eligible for Augie Choice after completing 2 semesters or 30 credits at Augustana only in those cases when the program has been approved by the International & Off-Campus Programs Office and the sponsoring athletic, music or co-curricular program has committed to a 3-year cycle in which students will only have an opportunity for international travel during their sophomore year.

5.

Students who withdraw from a credit-bearing or cocurricular program may not use Augie Choice funds to cover any nonrefundable charges from the program. Students who withdraw from a program during the limited window between receipt of Augie Choice funds and departure of the program will be expected to return the full amount of their Augie Choice grant to Augustana College. Students who withdraw from a program and return home early are not required to do so.



EXTERNAL SCHOLARSHIPS & GRANTS

Augustana College believes that cost should not be a prohibitive factor which keeps students from experiencing the transformational power of off-campus and international study. We recognize that each student faces unique challenges which might impact a decision to study away from our campus, but we are working to remove financial concerns from the decision-making process through Augie Choice and other grant opportunities.

Many of the most prominent grants are highly competitive and will typically only apply to semester or summer abroad programs, rather than faculty-led J-term programs. Here is a sampling of several of the most significant grant programs:

GILMAN SCHOLARSHIPS

Major grants for students who receive federal Pell Grants and who are enrolled in a program of at least 1 month in a single country. Students must be endorsed by Augustana, and we require a GPA of 3.50 in order to sponsor a student for these highly competitive national scholarships.

In addition to these, there are many scholarships particular to specific destinations as well as scholarships provided by partner organizations who sponsor most of Augustana's semester abroad programs. Students, once they have selected a program, particularly a semester or summer program should seek out both provider-sponsored grants and grants particular to the country or region of their program. Any of the search engines or scholarship listings cited above can help with this research.

When a student receives an outside grant, particularly one which acts as a discount to the program cost rather than a direct payment to the student, should consult with the International & Off-Campus Programs office so that the amount of the scholarship can be included as part of the student's financial aid package and charges for the semester or summer abroad can be reduced.

ELIGIBILITY

Sophomore status and 2.50 GPA. Some programs will require a higher GPA and a small number require prior study of the host country's language.

APPLICATION BASICS

Students apply first with Augustana. All applications are completed on Augustana's Studio Abroad website: http://augustana.studioabroad.com. The same site will be used for all required predeparture documents and orientation materials. After Augustana accepts a student candidate, the student will work with our partner organization on their admission process as well as any required visa documents.

Each semester has a primary application period. Programs which do not reach their capacity during this period will be open for further applications in the extended application period. The application periods for Fall and Spring are:

Fall Primary: Sept. 10 – Dec. 10 Spring Primary: Sept. 10 – Feb. 10 Fall Extension: Dec11 – Feb 10 Spring Extension: Feb 11 – May 10

DURING THE PRIMARY PERIOD: Students pay only the \$100 nonrefundable application fee at that time. The \$200 deposit, which applies to the cost of the semester, is required as confirmation only after a student has been accepted into the program of choice by Augustana.

<u>DURING THE EXTENDED PERIOD:</u> Student must pay both the \$100 application fee and the \$200 program deposit at the time of application. All payments are made to the Business Office at Augustana or online via the Business Office's study away deposit website.

SEMESTER STUDY AWAY

Augustana provides three types of semester away programs: University enrollment programs, Sponsored International Programs, and Internship-based programs. We offer over 50 program options, available every year, and open to students from all majors. Each of these programs is operated in agreement between Augustana and an external partner university or educational organization.



UNIVERSITY ENROLLMENT PROGRAMS (EXCHANGE OR DIRECT ENROLL)

Students attend a university overseas through an agreement between that university and Augustana. Those accepted by Augustana will apply directly to the partner university, will be able to choose from the full catalog of university courses offered at the host school and will study with a mix of national, international and American students. These programs may include housing if the partner university has on-campus accommodations for international students, however many universities do not have their own housing and will assist students through a housing office to find off-campus accommodations in student apartments.



SPONSORED INTERNATIONAL PROGRAMS

Students may study at a university or at a local study center sponsored by the organizing institution. These are typically programs made up of predominantly U.S.-based students, with a more limited course selection, though some will make use of local universities and have greater options. These programs typically have a greater level of student support services, and may feature an American-style curriculum and classroom setting, different from the typical university system in the host country. These programs also typically include housing options and group excursions, something not commonly found in university enrollment programs.



INTERNSHIP-BASED PROGRAMS

The majority of student credits will be earned as internship credits. In some programs these may be the only form of credits earned, with students engaged in a full-time internship of 30-35 hours per week. In other programs part-time internships of 20-30 hours per week are paired with 3-8 credits of seminar preparation and/or academic coursework. These programs typically provide housing and may include some excursions, but may not include as many group-based events, gatherings or excursions as a study program would.

REGISTRATION & COURSES ON SEMESTER AWAY COURSES

Students on a semester away program typically take 4-5 courses equaling 12-16 credits. Once accepted into a semester away program both by Augustana and by the program partner, students will work with the IOP Office, their Academic Advisor and Augustana academic departments to pre-approve coursework from the semester away program. While the student is away they will be registered only for the appropriate credit load of a generic "placeholder" course, such as "SWEDEN" or "JAPAN". When Augustana receives the transcripts from the partner university or organization, the appropriate courses are designated, based upon the pre-approved transfer equivalencies, and credit is given for all courses in which students have received a grade of C or higher (or equivalent).



Students receiving internship credit on a semester away program will register for the appropriate number of credits of CORE-INTR, as designated by the **CORE Career** Development Office. Students, in consultation with their academic major department, may also opt to designate up to 4 credits of INTR within their departmental major, rather than the generic CORE-INTR designation. To do so, students must usually complete additional assignments at the behest of their major department advisor. INTR credits are capped at 12. Many internship away programs may also offer academic courses as part of the program and these can be added to the credit load for the term to increase the term's credit profile from 12 to 15 or 16 credits.



GRADES & CREDITS FOR SEMESTER

Despite the fact that students remain enrolled at Augustana (with placeholder credits registered during the semester away), all semester-based study away coursework is treated as transfer coursework due to the transcript being generated by a partner university or organization. It is required that students have the external partner send a transcript or grade report directly to the Office of the Registrar. Transcripts sent to the student and hand-delivered will not be accepted.

As cited above, upon receipt of the official transcript or grade report from the program partner, credit will be provided for all pre-approved coursework completed with a grade of C or higher (or equivalent on the partner university's grade scale). Any course for which a student does not receive a grade of C or higher (or equivalent) will not be transferable and will result in a grade of NC (no-credit) for the equivalent amount of credits in the placeholder course. These NC credits will not count towards graduation requirements.

Only credits transfer back to Augustana, course grades do not, so no course on a semester away program will impact or adjust student GPA. However, as the semester programs are treated as part of the Augustana curriculum, students earning transfer credits through an Augustana-approved study away program in their senior year will not be considered to be in violation of the rule requiring that the final 24 credits of study be conducted at Augustana.

ORIENTATION FOR SEMESTER PROGRAM

All semester away students are required to complete an orientation program in the term or semester prior to departure. This will include several required online components found on the same Studio Abroad website which contains the program information and the required program documents for Augustana. It will also include between 1-3 large group meetings in which all semester participants. from across the different programs preparing for departure, will work with the IOP Director on topics ranging from safety and predeparture planning to intercultural awareness and strategies for being a good ambassador of Augustana and the United States while abroad. These sessions are mandatory and any student who fails to attend required orientation sessions or complete required predeparture documents and assessments can have their approval removed for the program, and would be therefore lose the right to use financial aid through Augustana to participate in the program.



SEMESTER FINANCIAL AID

- All Federal, State & Augustana Aid is applied to an approved semester away as if it were an on-campus semester.
- Work-Study is not available on semesters away.
- Full tuition waiver for family of Augustana employees or tuition exchange students does not apply to semesters away. Students on these programs will receive aid as designated appropriate by their FAFSA filing.
- All semester programs are Augie Choice eligible for students in their junior or senior year. Transfer students may access Augie Choice after one year of study at Augustana.
- A wide range of institutional, partner, and national or international grants and scholarships are also potential sources of financial support. Visit the Funding Study Away page for more information.

REFUND & WITHDRAWAL

- The \$100 application fee is nonrefundable.
- All other fees may be fully or partially refundable dependent upon the time of withdrawal.
- A full refund & withdrawal policy is included at the end of this catalog and from the IOP Office.
 Copies of the Refund & Withdrawal Policy will be included in the acceptance letter for all programs.
- Semester programs are governed by the host institution or partner university. Refunds are dependent upon refundable costs through the partner organization.
- Each Augustana semester abroad has a Refund Guarantee Deadline, beyond which students are not guaranteed a full refund of their program fees. This deadline is April 1 for all upcoming fall semester programs and August 1 for all spring semester programs.



The semester application process involves several steps, all of which are important if you wish to join one of the approved programs found in this catalog. If you are interested in a program which is not found in this catalog, please meet with the Director of International Programs to discuss how to enroll and transfer credit. For all approved programs (those found in the following pages) the process is as follows:

SEMESTER APPLICATION PROCESS IN DETAIL

STEP 1

AUGUSTANA APPLICATION

- Use this catalog and the links to program websites to select the best program for you.
- Apply for Augustana approval and financial aid use by completing the Augustana application found at
 http://augustana.studioabroad.com. Detailed step-by-step instructions on how to complete the Studio Abroad
 application are available at www.augustana.edu/studyaway or at the IOP Office within CORE in Olin Hall.
- Make the nonrefundable application fee at the Business Office or online at www.augustana.edu/study-away-deposit. If you are applying during the Primary App Period the deposit will be \$100, if applying during the Extended App Period, the deposit is \$300 (with \$100 nonrefundable).
- Await your email acceptance notification before moving on to Step Two.

STEP 2

PARTNER APPLICATION

- Your acceptance letter from Augustana will include some "next steps", including online forms and other requirements. Augustana will notify the partner organization or university for the program you have chosen that you have been approved by Augustana for their program..
- You will now need to apply on the website for the partner program. Use the web link found on the program's
 page in this catalog or on the Augustana Study Away website. Be sure to apply to the correct program at the
 partner organization, as each organization offers many programs not included on the Augustana endorsed
 program list, and you have been approved only for the program found on the list. If you have difficulty finding
 the program on the provider's website, contact the IOP Office for assistance.
- You should NOT send in a deposit with your application. Augustana will handle all deposits and payments for you. You are only responsible for making the appropriate payments to Augustana for the semester of your program. You will be billed for this semester as you normally are for on-campus semesters.

STEP 3

CONFIRMATION & PREDEPARTURE

- When you receive your acceptance from the partner organization or university, you should upload the acceptance letter (or email) into your Studio Abroad account. This will be one of the required documents needed in order to confirm your participation in the program.
- Following this, you should complete all required Augustana documents in your Studio Abroad account as well as all documents (for acceptance and for visa processes) required by the partner organization. There will be some redundancy between Augustana's requirements and the partner's. This is normal. You will also be required to attend predeparture meetings on campus the semester prior to your departure.

WHAT IS ISSAP?

ISSAP stands for Internship and Study Semester in Asia Pacific, a unique program that takes advantage of our partner, Global Academic Venture's network of internships and academic partnerships in Australia, New Zealand and Asia by allowing students to visit multiple locations during a single semester, for both academic study with faculty from local universities teaching specialized courses, and for internships, allowing students to match their interests to the location with the best offerings in each field.

COURSES

Each student on the ISSAP Program completes 2 or 3 academic courses as well as 6 credits of INTR internship credit through CORE. The program structure includes the following components:

- 1 Three-Week intensive course offered in Auckland
- 1-2 Four-week intensive courses offered in Sydney
- An 8-week full-time internship in your major field in either Auckland, Sydney, Hong Kong or Singapore.
- Courses offered typically deal with the Economics and Business Climate of Asia Pacific, but other offerings may be available for students seeking credit in other fields.



AUGUSTANA-LED J-TERM SHORT PROGRAMS



ELIGIBILITY

All J-Term programs require sophomore status and a 2.00 GPA both at the time of application through the semester prior to travel. A student who is initially accepted with a 2.00 GPA or higher may be removed (at student expense) from a program if their GPA drops below the 2.00 threshold at any point before departure. J-Term programs, unless offered through the World Languages, Literatures & Cultures Department as language immersion courses, require no foreign language background.

As part of our commitment to experiential learning, Augustana sponsors off-campus J-Term Away programs in which groups of 10-28 students travel with faculty both within the United States and to overseas destinations. The J-Term Away programs are discipline specific, but open to students of all majors and are designed to explore a new location with a specific focus, a much more intensive focus than tourism typically provides. All the programs are designed to combine academic study with experiential learning to broaden each student's education.

J-Term programs may be structured in several different ways, however the most common structures are listed below



SINGLE COURSE (4 CREDITS)

This course offered during the January interim period and preceded by a series of predeparture orientation meetings (non-credit) in the Fall semester



TWO 2-CREDIT COURSES

One offered in the Fall and including predeparture meetings for the travel group, and one offered as part of the January interim term



SPRING SEMESTER 4-CREDIT COURSE

The course is offered on campus and followed by a 0-credit travel experience in June. This final model does require registration for the 0credit course, but does not require payment of summer tuition.

All three models typically focus on a single field of study, though in some cases two parallel programs of study will join together in travel and accommodations while offering separate excursions, guest lecturers or assignments for their individual courses.

While there is a great deal of variability in some aspects of the J-term program of faculty-led courses, there is also a good deal of coherence among all programs. The following information is true of all programs.

APPLICATION PROCESS

All applications are completed on Augustana's Studio Abroad website: http://augustana.studioabroad.com. The same site will be used for all required predeparture documents and orientation materials.


All programs have a primary application period (September 10 – February 10) with an extended period (February 11 – May 10) for those programs which do not reach their capacity in the primary period. As many programs will close after the primary application period, we recommend all students apply during the primary period.

<u>DURING THE PRIMARY PERIOD:</u> Students pay only the \$100 nonrefundable application fee at that time. The \$200 deposit, which applies to the cost of the program, is required as confirmation only after a student has been accepted into the program of choice by Augustana.

DURING THE EXTENDED PERIOD: Students must pay both the \$100 application fee and the \$200 program deposit at the time of application. All payments are made to the Business Office at Augustana or online via the Business Office's study away deposit website.

Additional program payments for January programs are due July 15 and September 15 of the year prior. For programs with June travel, payments will be due November 15 and March 15.

FINANCIAL AID

As tuition is not part of the J-term fee, no Federal, State or Augustana financial aid may be applied to the cost of the J-Term course travel program.

All international J-term programs are Augie Choice eligible for students in their junior or senior year. Transfer students may access Augie Choice after one year of study at Augustana.

A limited number of domestic J-term programs are also Augie Choice eligible for the same students as listed above. This eligibility will be listed on the program's page within this catalog.

Additional Grants through Augustana, such as the IOP Office's Passport Grant, may apply to the J-Term programs. External national or international study away scholarships will not typically be available for a J-term program due to the short duration and single course nature of the programs.

REFUND & WITHDRAWAL

The \$100 application fee is nonrefundable. All other fees may be fully or partially refundable dependent upon the time of withdrawal. A full refund & withdrawal policy is available on the Augustana Study Away website and at the IOP Office. Copies of the Refund & Withdrawal Policy will be included in the acceptance letter for all programs. Each Augustana program abroad has a Refund Guarantee Deadline, beyond which students are not guaranteed a full refund of their program fees. This deadline is August 1 for all upcoming January or June J-Term programs.

BONAIRE

The Geology of the Caribbean

OVERVIEW

Field research has never been so appealing. Spend 2 weeks in the Netherlands Antilles island of Bonaire doing field work in Geology and exploring how this Caribbean island came to exist. This program offers coursework at two levels, a 100-level introductory course for newcomers to the geological sciences, and a 300-level advanced course for majors and minors with a Geology or Biology background.

Students will spend the first week of J-Term on campus, learning the science behind geologic processes, and then head off to Bonaire, where they will see first-hand, both above and beneath the waves, just how the island came to be. This program does require sufficient swimming skills to be able to snorkel and has an option for students with SCUBA certification to go even deeper in their exploration of the island's base.

BRAZIL

Afro-Brazilian Culture & Society

OVERVIEW

Travel to the heart of Afro-Brazilian Culture, Salvador de Bahia, as you study the rich traditions and the contemporary struggles of this vibrant community. Whether it is capoeira martial arts, samba dance or candomblé religious traditions, the heritage of Brazil's 14 million Afro-Brasileiros is alive in every aspect of South America's largest nation.

On this program students will spend the 3 week J-Term on the Brazilian coast, first in Rio de Janeiro for a brief acclimatization stop and then in the city of Salvador. Through their coursework on Brazilian Politics, students will focus on the history, arts and culture that built contemporary Afro-Brazilian identity as well as some of the contemporary issues that shape the community today. It will be a full-immersion experience as students live with families in Salvador as they study with Dr. Magalhães.

Eligibility & Program Cap: Participants must have a 2.00 GPA or higher and sophomore status to enroll. This program has no language requirement and all instruction is in English. The program cap is 22 students.

It is an outstanding program for anyone interested in Education, Social Welfare of children, or Psychology. The program visits Guatemala City, Antigua, Comalapa, Panajachel, Xela and El Tizate.

Spend your January in the beautiful Cascade mountains of Washington State at the Holden Village retreat center and explore these concepts with Dr. Varallo (COMM) and Dr. Wegman-Geedey (BIO).

The program includes train travel across Big Sky country to Washington, and three weeks of secluded beauty and tranquility at Holden Village. No cellphones, no Wi-Fi, no distractions from the awesome beauty of the mountains, the crisp air of a winter sky and the peace that comes from quiet contemplation. But don't get too cozy, there will be hikes and snowshoes, chores to be done and a community to enjoy as you spend your January intentionally far from the normal.

This program is open to all majors. It is particularly encouraged for students who wish to step back from a fast-paced academic life and spend some time in community and in exploration both inward and outward.

Water & Environmental Justice

OVERVIEW

This J-Term will explore the Louisiana Gulf Coast region of the United States through the lens of Geography. The program's course begins and ends with an on-campus component, with a 7-10 day trip to Louisiana as its centerpiece. As you study about water and environmental justice issues, both on campus and in the Gulf Coast region, you will apply research and analytical skills to questions of environmental degradation, structural inequalities and the impact of hazards such as Hurricane Katrina.

This program will travel to the Louisiana coast, including stops in Baton Rouge, Lafayette, and New Orleans. Along the way you will learn about the impact of coastal land loss, pollution, and environmental hazards, as well as efforts to buil more sustainable and socially just communities. The program is designed primarily for Geography and Environmental Studies majors though other students can join the program with permission of the instructor.

The program is split into two courses, with students enrolling in a 2-credit Fall semester course and a 2-credit January term course, so that your reading and background study is complete before you leave for Big Sky Country, and you can focus while you are there on the experiences and people you encounter. The combination of the two courses will provide students with a greater understanding of concepts of simplicity as well as PH and a D credit. Program includes 14 days in Montana and 2 days of train travel.

Beautiful desert scenery is the backdrop for the exploration of local flora, fauna and the issues which impact all living things in the desert Southwest.

Students will live at Ghost Ranch as they study and explore the rich biological life of the region. The Art group and the Biology group will share activities or excursions on some days and split to do their own specific projects or activities on others. There will be hiking, field research, guest speakers and opportunities to take in the dramatic desert beauty that is all around.

The Biology course will explore the impacts of human activities on regional biodiversity and will focus on Traditional (non-Western) Ecological Knowledge of indigenous communities for guidance on how to live sustainably for the Earlth's health.

It is an opportunity to learn about the realities of healthcare in the region and to lend a hand to professionals who are caring for entire communities.

This program chooses sites for the clinics based upon local need as well as regional safety and logistics considerations. The program each year could be conducted in Costa Rica, Panama or Nicaragua, depending upon the best combination of these factors and the potential for impactful service at each location.

CAMBODIA

Ethical Service Learning

OVERVIEW

Spend January engaged in community projects in Cambodia as you study the values and practices that shape ethical service learning and volunteer experiences. This 6-credit program includes on-campus study of best practices in volunteering during the Fall Semester and then a 3-week experience in the city of Siem Reap and the jungle of Mondulkiri in Cambodia.

Students will travel to Cambodia, visit the famous Angkor Wat temples and the hub city of Siem Riep. Following oncampus coursework to prepare you for the experience, students will participate in two very different volunteer opportunities, first working as English instructors and teaching partners both in a school in the shadow of the Angkor Wat ruins and with Buddhist monks in a monastery in Siem Reap itself. The group will then relocate to Sen Monorom in the Mondulkiri province to volunteer at a wild elephant sanctuary, where you will also have the chance to visit another refuge used to protect the endangered fresh water river dolphins.

The program includes a 4-credit Fall course and a 2-credit January course, which combined will provide students with PH and G suffixes as well as an SL designation for service learning. But the real reward will be the experience and the background in how to serve in an ethical way both at home and abroad.





The program will begin with a stay in Kyoto, Japan's ancient capital. There students will be able to visit the city's many temples, shrines and palaces as they explore the history and culture of Japan. The group will then travel to see the famous Inuyama Castle and the Uraken Japanese Garden.

The final stop on the tour will be the ultra-modern, yet equally ancient city of Tokyo, where the group will be able to experience Kabuki theatre, explore the famous Ginza, Shibuya and Shinjuku districts and meet with Japanese students from Augustana partner schools in the city. Along the way, students will visit with experts, and discuss the impact of a growing and aging population on infrastructure as well as culture.

Physical Theatre Workshop

OVERVIEW

The Austria J-Term program is an intensive workshop in physical theatre hosted by the International University Global Theatre Experience. Students will begin the J-Term on campus, where Dr. Cooper and Dr. Popple from the Theatre Department will introduce them to the work of Physical Theatre. They will then all travel together to Austria. After an acclimatization stay in Vienna, the group will settle in at the Retzhof Castle in Graz, where the full-immersion theatre workshop will begin in earnest.

Students will investigate, live and breathe the works of Stanislovsky, Chekhov and Meyerhold under the direction of Russian physical theatre specialist Sergei Ostrenko. They will learn exercises that lead to deeper self awareness and control over their physical instrument so that they can best express emotions and characters on stage.

Following a week of intensive theatre training, the group will return to Vienna to celebrate, reflect, and explore the theatrical heritage of the Austrian Capital before returning home for the final days of class to end the J-term experience. It is an ideal program for Theatre majors or minors, students who participate in theatrical productions and performers of all varieties.

Health, Education & Culture

OVERVIEW

Fjords, reindeer, the Aurora Borealis, quaint Bergen and bustling Oslo. Norway has so much to explore, and so much to understand about culture, social welfare, education and healthcare. This program will focus on modern Norway and the social structures put in place to care for its people. Travel to Oslo, Bergen, Tromso and the fjords with Dr. Crowe and Prof. Hanson on this whirlwind J-Term in Scandinavia.

The program begins with classes on campus before the group travels together to Norway for their on-site experiential learning program. The course will develop students' writing skills as it introduces them to both Nordic culture and the social welfare, education, and health systems of this often-cited example of social democracy.

The tour will include visits to healthcare, education, and social institutions as well as more touristic elements like a boat trip on a fjord, a train ride across Norway from Oslo to Bergen, a dogsled trek, and a Northern Lights chase up in the Arctic Circle (no guarantees, the Aurora can be fickle). It is an opportunity to learn about a different way of living and a different way of caring for each other, while also enjoying the warmth and hospitality of the Norwegian people.

SPAIN

The Camino de Santiago

OVERVIEW

Pilgrims have been hiking the Camino de Santiago across northern Spain for over 800 years, and with this Spring+June program so can you. Join Dr. Havard and Dr. Schultz on a two week hike across the beautiful landscapes of northern Spain on the road to the Cathedral of Santiago de Compostela. This program begins with a Spring Semester course on the history, culture and meaning of the pilgrimage, followed by June travel to Spain and a fully immersive experience unlike any other. On this program students will average 12 miles of hiking per day, with all their belongings in a backpack. It is a program that will challenge you physically, intellectually and perhaps spiritually as well.

Hike the trail, stay at small rustic piglrim hostels along the way, sharing your story with other pilgrims and hikers as you make your way to Santiago. The course will explore the who, what and why people have been making this trek for centuries, and will give you a chance to explore your own motivations. It is a unique experience, a unique course, and a chance to challenge yourself to do something that might just change you and your outlook on life, your faith, your capabilities and your goals.

No knowledge of Spanish is required.

Course(s) & Credits: All students will enroll in SPST 344: Pilgrims & Pilgrimage on the Camino de Santiago (4-credits, PH, G) during Spring Semester and a 0-credit International Experience Program course as a summer course.

AUGUSTANA SUMMER STUDY AWAY

Augustana offers two types of summer study away programs:



AUGUSTANA-SPONSORED PROGRAMS

These programs' academic credit is offered directly by Augustana College.



TRANSFER PROGRAMS

Students apply directly to the provider and work with the International & Off-Campus Program Office to petition transfer credit for courses or internship credit earned.

Augustana-Sponsored Programs include the Summer Spanish in the Andes Program and the Summer French in Dijon Program. The guidelines on this page apply only to these Augustana-sponsored programs.

ELIGIBILITY

Both summer programs require sophomore status and a 2.00 GPA at the time of application through the semester prior to travel. A student who is initially accepted with a 2.00 GPA or higher may be removed (at student expense) from a program if their GPA drops below the 2.00 threshold at any point



APPLICATION PROCESS

All applications for Augustana-sponsored programs are completed on Augustana's Studio Abroad website: <u>augustana.studioabroad.com</u>. The same site will be used for all required predeparture documents and orientation materials. All programs have a primary application period (September 10 – December 10) with an extended period (December 11 – February 10).

Students applying during the Primary period pay only the \$100 nonrefundable application fee at that time. The \$200 deposit, which applies to the cost of the semester, is required as confirmation only after a student has been accepted into the program of choice by Augustana.

Students applying during the extended period must pay both the \$100 application fee and the \$200 program deposit at the time of application.

Additional program payments for Summer programs are due April 1 and May 1. Only students who are paid in full by the May 1 deadline are guaranteed clearance to travel on the summer program. Students with incomplete payments or incomplete predeparture documentation on Studio Abroad may be denied participation in the summer program until such time as both the forms and the payments are complete. If a student fails to complete either by the set deadline in May, they will be withdrawn from the program and any nonrefundable costs will be billed to them or retained from their refund.

FINANCIAL AID

No Federal, State or Augustana financial aid may be applied to the cost of a summer study away program.

All approved summer programs, whether Augustana-sponsored or not, are Augie Choice eligible for students in the summer after their sophomore or junior years. Transfer students may access Augie Choice after one year of study at Augustana.

Additional Grants through Augustana, such as the IOP Office's Passport Grant, may apply to the Augustana-sponsored programs.

It is also possible, if the application is completed in a timely manner, for students to apply for national or international grants towards summer language study.

REFUND & WITHDRAWAL

The \$100 application fee is nonrefundable. All other fees may be fully or partially refundable dependent upon the time of withdrawal.

A full refund & withdrawal policy is available on the Augustana Study Away website and at the IOP Office.

Copies of the Refund & Withdrawal Policy will be included in the acceptance letter for all programs.

The summer abroad programs have a Refund Guarantee Deadline, beyond which students are not guaranteed a full refund of their program fees. This deadline is April 1 for all upcoming summer programs.

EXTERNAL & TRANSFER SUMMER PROGRAMS

In addition to the two language immersion programs sponsored by Augustana, the college has endorsed programs in both German and Swedish language, and provides a list of trusted summer internship abroad providers. These programs are treated as truly external offerings, with transferable credit but which require no Augustana registration or payments to Augustana College. They are essentially treated the same as we would treat any transferable courses taken at universities within the United States over the summer.

Students who wish to enroll in any of these programs, or any other external, university credit summer abroad program, may do so with permission of the International & Off-Campus Programs Office, who will assist them with the credit transfer process.

Students enrolling in these programs do not apply through Augustana, make no payments to Augustana College, and all credit is treated as transfer credit from the program provider or university of record.

Students are expected, as part of their preparation for the external study away summer program, to register this program with the IOP Office and to complete documents which release Augustana of liability for the external program and provide Augustana with key program information which will assist with the transfer of credits.



ECUADORSummer Spanish Program

AMERICAS SUMMER

OVERVIEW

For more than 30 years, Augustana and CEDEI in Cuenca Ecuador, have been offering students the chance to spend their summer fully immersed in a Spanish-speaking environment as they explore the Andean region and study language, literature, culture and art.

Choose between the 11-week program, open to students at all Spanish levels, or, for students at the Advanced (300) level, there is an intensive 5-week option. Both programs include a rich selection of excursions, events and cultural events and both offer the same enriching family stays as the housing for the summer. Students in the 11-week program receive the added bonus of a mid-program excursion to the rainforest of Ecuador's Oriente region as well as a program-final trip to Peru, to explore Cusco and the lost city of Machu Picchu.



Summer 2019 will be the final summer prior to the shift from trimesters to semesters and the switch to a 4-credit standard course. For the Summer 2019 Ecuador program, this means the program will retain its selection of 3-credit courses available at all academic levels.

BUDGET & FEES

Program Fee: Estimated Program fees for 2019 are \$9,600 for 11-weeks or \$7,400 for the 5-week program.

Includes: Tuition, roundtrip airfare from/to Miami, ground transport, accommodations, meals in homestay, all excursions, full time support staff, and medical insurance.

Does not Include: Flights To/From Miami, non-homestay meals and discretionary spending.

Out of Pocket Estimate: Estimated outof-pocket costs range between \$1,000 and \$1,500, depending on student spending habits and flight costs to/from Miami

DETAILS

Eligibility & Program Cap:

Requires sophomore status (completion of 1 full year of college study prior to departure) and a 2.00 GPA. The 11-week program has no requirement for prior study of Spanish. The 5-week program is only offered for students at the Advanced level, and requires completion of Spanish 301 or 305 at Augustana or 5th Semester Spanish for non-Augustana students.

This program is open to Augustana and non-Augustana students.

Non-Augustana students should contact the Director of International & Off-Campus Programs for application information. You will be required to enroll as a summer-only student at Augustana as part of the application process.

Summer Spanish in the Andes

COURSES

11-Week Program Courses: Course placement dependent upon prior study of Spanish or placement exam.

Spanish 150 (9 credits): Beginning Spanish Equivalent to Augustana's Spanish 101-102-103. No prerequisite. Recommended for students with one semester or less of college Spanish.

Spanish 250 (9 credits): Intermediate Spanish Equivalent to Augustana's 201-202-203. Prerequisite is Spanish 103 or two semesters of college Spanish.

Spanish 350 (9 credits): Advanced Spanish Equivalent to Spanish 301, 327 and 3 credits of 300 level elective. Prerequisite is Spanish 203 or four semesters of college Spanish.

Upper –Level Literature & Culture Electives

Available to any student who has completed Spanish 301, 305 or 5 semesters of college Spanish. Students in the 11-week program choose 3 of the 4 courses for their 9 credit program. Students on the 5-week program must enroll in both courses which are offered during weeks 1-5 of the program.

Art 343SA: Art of the Americas (PA/G): Weeks 1-5 A 3-credit Art course taught in Spanish and English. Study the major modes of artistic expression in Andean culture.

Spanish 458: Indigenous Culture & Literature (PH) Weeks 1-5. Equivalent to Spanish 344 for majors and minors at Augustana. 3 credits.

Spanish 454: Latin American History (PP)
Weeks 6-11. Equivalent to Spanish 326 for majors and minors at Augustana. 3 credits.

Spanish 457: Contemporary Latin Am. Society: Weeks 6-11. Equivalent to Spanish 327 for majors and minors at Augustana. 3 credits.

HOUSING & TRAVEL

Housing: While in Cuenca, Ecuador, students live with local families. Students are housed 1 per family, with private rooms. Each family is carefully vetted and complete an orientation program to prepare them to host our students.

Excursions: The 11-week program includes excursions to Quito, Otavalo, the Oriente, Peru (Lima, Cusco, Machu Picchu) and several towns in the vicinity of Cuenca. The 11-week program includes only the Quito, Otavalo and local excursions.

DIJONSummer French Program

EUROPE SUMMER

OVERVIEW

Each summer, Augustana, in partnership with the Centre International D'Études Françaises of the Université de Bourgogne, conducts a six-week program in the heart of France with immersive study of French language and culture. During the program, students may opt to live with a local family or stay at university residence halls with other international students, enjoy a wide range of Cultural activities both on campus and in the community and visit other regions of France on faculty-led overnight excursions.



DETAILS

Eligibility & Program Cap: This program Requires sophomore status (completion of 1 full year of college study prior to departure) and a 2.00 GPA. There is no requirement of prior study of French, though the program is recommended for students of French language, culture and literature.

This program is open to Augustana and non-Augustana students.

Non-Augustana students should contact the Director of International & Off-Campus Programs for application information. You will be required to enroll as a summer-only student at Augustana as part of the application process.

BUDGET & FEES

Program Fee: Estimated Program fees for 2019 are \$6,000. The Augustana Study Away website will provide updated and finalized program fees.

Includes: Tuition, ground transport, accommodations, meals in homestay, all excursions, full time support staff, and medical insurance.

Does not Include: Airfare, non-homestay meals and discretionary spending.

Out of Pocket Estimate: Estimated out-of-pocket costs range between \$1,800 and \$2,600, depending on student spending habits and flight costs to/from Paris.

Summer French in Dijon

COURSES

Summer 2019 will be the final summer prior to the shift from trimesters to semesters and the switch to a 4-credit standard course. For the Summer 2019 Dijon program, this means the program will retain its selection of 3-credit courses available at all academic levels

All students will receive 6 credits of French. Students at the 100 (Beginning) level will receive 6 credits of French language while those at the 200 or 300 level will receive 3 credits of French language and 3 of French Civilization. Courses included in the program are:

French 111: Beginning Conversational French (6 credits)

French 210: Topics in French Culture French 221, 222, or 223: Intermediate French

French 310: Topics in French Cultural Studies French 321, 322, or 323: Advenced French

Placement between the 21, 22, and 23 courses Is determined by placement exam and prior study of French at the college level.

Students who complete French 310 will also receive a PP Learning Perspective credit at Augustana.

DATES

The Dijon program typically runs from early July through mid-August. For 2019 dates Please contact the Director of International Programs or any faculty member in the French program at Augustana.

HOUSING & TRAVEL

Housing: Homestay accommodations are recommended for maximum language and culture immersion. Students may also opt to live in on-campus residence halls. The program fee quoted here is for the homestay (with meals included). Students option for the residence hall will be given a meal stipend of equivalent value.

Excursions: The program includes 2-3 overnight excursions to be determined after the group has been selected. Recent locations have included Provence, Paris and the French Alps.

Travel: Students are responsible for travel to/from Paris. They will be met in Paris for transfer to Dijon. Students may opt to travel on their own prior to or following the program dates,

but should plan carefully so as to not miss an program components.



EICHSTÄTT Summer German Program

EUROPE SUMMER

OVERVIEW


The Summer German program at Catholic University in Eichstätt, Germany is a program recommended by Augustana's German Studies program but not affiliated with or managed by Augustana College. It is a month-long immersion program for which students can earn up to 6 transfer credits in German Studies and is appropriate for students of German Studies as well as any student who wishes to develop language skills in German.

Students enroll directly at KUEI (Katholische Universitat Eichstätt-Ingolstadt) and credit is transferred back to Augustana. Students must earn the equivalent of a C or higher in each course at KUEI in order to transfer these credits back to Augustana.

The program offers coursework in Beginning (100), Intermediate (200) and Advanced German (300). The program cost is typically in a range of \$1,100-\$1,500 and includes housing on the campus of KUEI. The program fee does not include airfare, transportation to Eichstatt from your arrival airport, or most meals.

Students interested in this program follow the following process:

- Consult with an advisor from the German Studies Program (Dr. Seidlitz is recommended)

UPPSALASummer Swedish Program

EUROPE SUMMER

OVERVIEW

The Summer Swedish program in Uppsala, Sweden is a program recommended by Augustana's Scandinavian Studies program but not affiliated with or managed by Augustana College. Sponsored by Uppsala International Summer Session, a private language school in the university town of Uppsala, the summer program is structured in a series of 3-week intensive courses. Augustana recommends students enroll in two or all three of these periods. With the preapproval of the Scandinavian Studies Department students can transfer up to 6 credits of Scandinavian Studies coursework back to Augustana. This program is appropriate for students of Scandinavian Studies with prior study of Swedish language or pure beginners.

Students enroll directly at UISS and credit is transferred back to Augustana. Students must earn the equivalent of a C or higher in each course at KUEI in order to transfer these credits back to Augustana.

The program offers coursework in Beginning (100), Intermediate (200) and Advanced Swedish(300). The program cost is typically in a range of \$5,500-\$6,000 for the full 9 week program and includes housing, one meal per day and several group excursions and social events.

REFUND & WITHDRAWAL POLICY

An application fee of \$100 and a program deposit of \$200 is required for all applications, though timing varies based on the application cycle. This document outlines policies for withdrawal from a program after acceptance and the policies pertaining to the refund of the initial program deposit and subsequent program charges should a student withdraw from a program.

Please read this document carefully and share it with anyone who might be assisting you with the payments for your study away experience. You will receive a second copy of this document when upon acceptance to a study away program.

- Applications completed during the Primary App Period are required to include the \$100 application fee at the time of application and the \$200 deposit upon acceptance into the chosen program. Applications during the Extended App Period must make both the fee payment and deposit at the time of application. Any student who withdraws their application prior to acceptance into the chosen program will be granted a refund of the \$200 deposit if made with the application. The \$100 application fee is nonrefundable.
- A refund of the \$200 deposit will be given to any student accepted into a program who then withdraws prior to the Refund Guarantee Deadline. See the accompanying chart below for the date of this deadline for each program type.
- As of the Refund Guarantee Date, the college will begin to make nonrefundable deposits for airfare or other program expenses, funds which are not recoverable should a student withdraw. For this reason a full refund is not possible after this date, except in the case of faculty-led J-Term (January or June programs), in which a refund of the \$200 deposit and any subsequent payments will be granted to a student withdrawing after the Refund Guarantee Deadline if that student's position in the program roster is replaced by another student from the Alternate or Waitlist for the given program. This option is not available for summer or semester away programs.
- After the Refund Guarantee Date, for semester and summer programs as well as any J-Term programs without an active Alternate or Waitlist, the withdrawing student will receive all monies minus the following:
 - a. Any non-refundable deposits made to program partner organizations, sponsors or travel providers.
 - b. Any "shared" or "fixed" costs on faculty-led programs. These costs are those program expenses which are shared equally by all student participants and are not billed to the program on a perstudent basis. This includes the shared expenses of faculty travel and compensation, and any group-billed program components that are not specified as a per-student fee.
- In the event that a student withdraws from the program after the Refund Guarantee Date_and the nonrefundable charges are greater than the initial \$200 deposit or any subsequent payments, the student will be billed for the total of nonrefundable charges and shared costs as outlined in section 4 above. Failure to make these payments following a program withdrawal can lead to an administrative block on college functions such as registration or availability of official transcripts to employers or graduate schools, until such time as the debt is paid to Augustana College.
- There is no change to this policy as a program nears its departure date or as later payment dates pass, except that the charges deemed to be nonrefundable are likely to increase as a program nears its departure date.

Students who are removed from a program prior to departure by Augustana College due either to a change in their academic eligibility or in response to a disciplinary concern are treated as any other withdrawal and these students are responsible for all program fees or charges as outlined above. This includes any student whose cumulative GPA drops below minimum program requirements, students who are placed on probation or suspension due to honor code violations or who are deemed unfit to travel by the Dean of Students Office due to drug, alcohol, Title IX, or other disciplinary violations of the Code of Conduct.

Students who are forced to withdraw from a program prior to departure but after the Refund Guarantee Deadline due to a medical or mental health emergency or at the recommendation of a physician or mental health professional may obtain a full refund of all charges, minus the initial \$300 deposit, but are required to provide an affidavit or letter of endorsement from their physician or mental care professional, attesting to their professional recommendation that the student not travel. Failure to provide this statement of support for the withdrawal on medical or mental health grounds at the time of withdrawal will result in students being charged all nonrefundable and shared costs.

In the event that a student must end participation in the program due to medical or mental health concerns at some time during the program itself, the college would retain an amount to cover the non-refundable costs already expended on behalf of that student as well as the student's portion of the "fixed costs".

Students who elect to terminate their participation in a program reasons other than mental or physical health concerns, as well as those who are removed from a program for disciplinary reasons, will receive no refund of charged program expenses and will be charged any additional costs associated with their adjusted itinerary and early return to the United States.

If a student chooses to withdraw from this program, they must send an e-mail message to the Director of International and Off-Campus Programs (IOP) at international programs@augustana.edu. A copy of this withdrawal notification should be provided to the faculty director of the program in those cases when the program is a faculty-led January, June or Summer program. The withdrawal date will be considered the date when this e-mail withdrawal request is received. Upon receipt of the withdrawal notice, the Director of IOP will contact the Business Office to authorize the appropriate refund.
