Teacher candidates majoring in Middle Grades (5-8) English complete 32 credits from the Secondary Education Program professional sequence and 42 credits of language arts content which includes: ENGL 215, 260, 265, 210,310, and COMM 203; ENGL 250, 325, or 326; one from ENGL 365, 370, 375, 385, or 395E; one from ENGL 270, 275, 278, 290, or 390; ENGL 350, 285, 345, or 295; an ENGL elective 300 or higher; and EDUC 382. Candidates can also earn licensure to teach English Language Arts in grades 9-12 by completing the major in English Education.
