Major Overview

Our goal is to ensure that our majors and minors have "core competencies" in two areas: the history of philosophy and argument articulation. We expect our departmental students to develop skill sets that enable them to engage in rigorous argumentation not only in the classroom, but also in the challenges that they will encounter after their years at Augustana. We also expect our majors and minors to have a sense of the history of philosophy—not only of

who responded to whom, but also of the richness of the metaphysical, epistemological, and normative traditions that have shaped major philosophical movements as well as significant advancements in numerous other disciplines.

Our larger aim is that *every* student enrolled in a philosophy course receives significant exposure to the discipline of careful argumentation. To this end, as well as the end of the college-wide emphasis on critical reasoning, we offer our students exposure to several types of argument, the evaluation of arguments, and the ability to identify and address both formal and informal fallacies.
