Major in Women, Gender, & Sexuality Studies (WGSS): 28 credits

- Foundations course: WGSS 130: Introduction to Women, Gender, and Sexuality Studies (4 credits)
- Theory course: WGSS 330: Feminist Theories or WGSS 350: Queer Theories (4 credits)
- Senior Inquiry experience: WGSS 430: Applied Gender/Sexuality Studies (4 credits) or a 4-credit SI project in another department if the project fulfills the objectives of WGSS and is approved by the WGSS Faculty Working Board. The SI may be a research paper, an internship, or an activism project. Prereq: WGSS 330.
- 0-credit capstone experience (a formal presentation of your Senior Inquiry at a WGSS Tea Talk). Graded as Pass/Fail.
- 8 credits of approved elective courses. At least 4 of these credits must be at the 300 level.
- 8 additional credits of WGSS program courses. At least 4 of these credits must be at the 300 level.

Women, Gender, and Sexuality Studies is a growing discipline involving new scholarship that is both interdisciplinary **and** focused within departmental offerings. The WGSS-coded classes demonstrate the connections between fields such as the humanities and social sciences.

Women, Gender, and Sexuality Studies is taught from a global perspective, and WGSS-230 meets Augustana's "G" (global) requirement. Due to the growth of international feminist movements, including the establishment of research centers, cultural and artistic groups, publishing companies and political action groups, internships are available.

In addition to the major and minor, the Women, Gender, Sexuality Studies Program helps to sponsor lectures, visiting scholars, films and other events.
